The Passage (Journey begins)

God did not lead them through the land of the Philistines, although it was near; for God said, "Lest perhaps the people change their minds when they see _____, and return to Egypt". So God led the people around by the way of the wilderness of the Red Sea. And Moses took the _____ of Joseph with him.

As the children of Israel looked up in the sky, they saw a strange cloud. God was with them in the cloud. When the cloud moved, they _____. When the cloud stopped, they stopped. At night, the cloud turned to a pillar of _____.

How does He lead believers today? His written Word and the Holy Spirit

When Pharaoh saw that the Israelites were not coming back after three days, he gathered his army and _____ of his best chariots and all the other chariots in Egypt and led them in a chase. Their power was no match for God.

The Israelites were camped near the Red Sea. They could hear and see their enemy coming. What were they to do? The Red Sea was in front of them and to the west and south of them were mountains. They were trapped and afraid.

The cloud that had traveled in front of them now moved to separate them from the Egyptian army. The cloud made it _____ for the Egyptians but gave light for the Israelites all that _____

God told Moses to stretch his rod over the Red Sea. The waters parted and a great east wind blew and made a wall of _____ on each side of the sea. The seabed became dry, so that the Israelites could cross over on dry ground.

Then the Egyptians followed them, but the Lord threw them into confusion. Their chariot wheels began to come off. The Egyptians knew that _____ was fighting for Israel. God told Moses to stretch out his hand over the sea again and the waters rushed back over the Egyptian armies and their leader.

Miracles – not everyday occurrences God caused the Red Sea to temporarily disobey the normal principles of gravity. Miracles are supernatural interventions by God into the natural order of the world in a way that accomplishes His purposes and brings glory to His _____. There are over _____ miracles recorded in Scripture.

Moses led his people southward into the desert. After about _____ days, the water supply ran out. They came to a place called Marah. (see map on the last page) The water was bitter. They complained to Moses.

God showed Moses a special tree and told him to throw it into the water. After Moses did this the water became _____. God knows how to sweeten bitter waters.

After the Israelites left Marah, they came to Elim, where there were 12 wells of water and _____ palm trees. (see map) They camped there almost a month.

As they traveled on toward Sinai, they were getting hungry. They started complaining again. Oh, that we had died in Egypt. At least we had meat and bread to fill us up.

So God decided to _____ His people to see if they would follow His detailed instructions. God sent meat (quail) in the evening and bread in the morning. The Israelites called it manna.

Psalms 78:25 says it was angel's food. They were instructed to go out each day and gather 2 quarts for each person, and on the sixth day, they were to gather _____

quarts per person, in preparation for the Sabbath day.

They were not to keep any of it overnight or it would be full of worms and have a terrible _____ . But the extra that they gathered on the sixth day would keep perfectly fine until the Sabbath day.

Moses told the people the reason for this was that the Lord has appointed tomorrow as a day of _____ , a holy Sabbath to the Lord. On this day we will rest from our normal daily tasks. And there was _____ manna rained down from heaven on the Sabbath day.

John 6:48-51 Jesus compares Himself to manna.

“I am the bread of life, Jesus said. Your fathers did eat manna in the wilderness, and are dead.

This is the bread which comes down from heaven, that a man may eat thereof, and not die. I am the living bread which came down from heaven: if any man _____

of this bread, he shall live forever: and the bread that I will give is my flesh, which I will give for the life of the world”

To eat this living bread, we are to accept Jesus Christ as our Savior and become united with Him.

God also told Moses to take 2 quarts of manna and keep it FOREVER as a treasured memorial of the Lord’s provision. He eventually placed it in the _____ of the covenant for safekeeping. This was so that later generations could see the bread that God provided in the wilderness.
